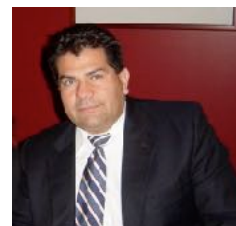
Meet Our Chapter Executive Board

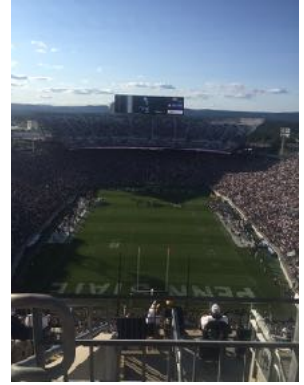

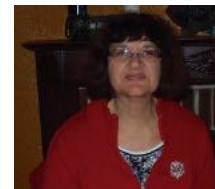


Additional Chapter Board Members



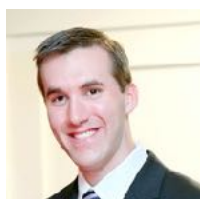

At our Chapter's December 12, 2016 Volunteer Recognition Dinner at General Warren Inn, Chapter President Ann Mau presented our Lifetime Achievement Award to Florence Hoffritz.

Florence began her long history of service as our chapter's Corresponding Secretary in 2000. The Internet and e-mail were starting to be used routinely for office communications. Florence compiled our member's e-mail addresses and began her twice weekly e-mail blasts with our comprehensive chapter updates on all things Penn State.

Florence served as editor of our bi-annual Newsletter for 16 years. Layout, clip art, article writing and printing all were arranged by Florence. Her work has spanned everything from Kimmel Center Orchestra tours and concerts to Phillies fireworks games and stadium tours as well as bus trips to New York City and all Big 10 home games.

Berkey Creamery ice cream sales were Florence's specialty and a great fundraiser for our chapter. Florence would compile our members' orders. Then she and her husband Dave would travel to University Park to pick up our ice cream. Florence instructed Creamery workers exactly how she wanted our containers packed on dry ice – so Florence could unpack efficiently these same containers the next day for sale at our Student Send Off Picnic.

Florence Hoffritz has led an extraordinary life of service. Our chapter honors her for her dedication, hard work and abiding love for Penn State with our Lifetime Achievement Award.

2016-17 YEAR in REVIEW
A Message from President Ann Mau

Our 2016-2017 fiscal year was a busy and dynamic period. The Penn State Alumni Association recognized us as a *Chapter of Distinction* at the highest rung of achievement, the *Elm Level*. Only 18 of 300 Chapters nationwide attain Elm Level status through community service, membership, scholarship funding, THON, student involvement and more. You, our members, enabled us to earn this honor.

Our 37th annual August Send Off Picnic in West Chester drew 150 incoming Penn State students, their parents and family members. More than 40 event volunteers put up tents, decorated our pavilion blue and white, grilled burgers for our barbeque and scooped Creamery ice cream for dessert. For the health conscious our buffet included green salads, fresh fruit and watermelon. Incoming students with their parents and family members were given practical orientation pointers from both upperclassmen and parents of current students. Our Nittany Lion mascot posed with families for photographs while our Alumni Blue Band played fight songs and concluded with all of us singing our alma mater.

During football season our chapter sponsored bus trips leaving from the Great Valley campus in Malvern to all Big 10 home games. For away games – and our January Rose Bowl game – we organized TV tailgate watching events at local restaurants. And our chapter marched in the annual Homecoming Parade in State College. In December and June we sponsored bus trips to New York City. And in January we offered a PSU hockey game at Wells Fargo Center preceded by a tailgate at Xfinity Live.

Commitment to community service is a hallmark of our chapter. Our alumni volunteered at Cradles to Crayons in Conshohocken to help children living in low income and homeless situations. We worked at Habitat for Humanity

of Chester County in Coatesville on new housing benefiting local families.

Quarterly networking/social events are sponsored throughout Chester County to connect our alumni. Whether you live or work in Chester County, these gatherings promote alumni interaction. A guided tour of Victory Brewing Company in Downingtown followed by tastings was our spring networking event.

Our chapter reserved tickets for the annual Phillies Fireworks game at Citizens Bank Park. This year's game is Thursday, July 6, 2017 against the Pittsburgh Pirates followed by a dynamic fireworks show.

Our chapter leadership works regularly with other Penn State Alumni chapters to exchange ideas and promote joint projects. Implementation of the Tassl app can foster inter chapter communications. And our recent implementation of Pay Pal can expedite and simplify alumni electronic payments for events and Chapter membership.

Our Board has planning meetings on the second Monday of each month at 7 p.m. at the Krapf Alumni House on the Great Valley campus in Malvern. Come to add your input, energy and ideas to enrich our chapter.

Chapter Scholarships to Penn State Students Living in Chester County



Our Chapter is proud to have two fully funded Endowments that provide scholarships in the amount of approximately \$6,500 to Chester County students attending a Penn State Campus.

Our **Trustee Matching Scholarship** awards \$5,000 in scholarship monies to students regardless of which campus they attend. The scholarship recipient is chosen by the Office of Financial Aid at the University.

Our **Brandywine Endowed Scholarship** awards \$1,500 in scholarship monies to a student attending the Brandywine Campus. The recipient of this scholarship is chosen by the Office of Financial Aid at the Brandywine Campus.

To qualify for these scholarships, students must have the **FAFSA** form on file with the University. The amount of each award is determined by the value of the endowment and the interest it is earning.

Our Chapter would love to increase these endowments so we can have **more monies awarded to our local students**. Please consider making a **TAX DEDUCTIBLE** donation to these Endowments by purchasing raffle tickets which benefit our Scholarship Fund and/or donating directly to our Scholarship Fund via the Membership/Donation Form on page 11. Checks to the Endowments must be made payable to **Penn State University**. All donations will be acknowledged by both the Chapter and Penn State University.

As of press time, Penn State is still in the process of determining the students who are to be our scholarship recipients for 2017-18.
